4. When reading the incident of the healing of the man with the withered hand, Matthew 12:9-14; Mark 3:1-6; Luke 6:6-11, what overwhelming sin do you see in the life of the Religious Leaders. (Jesus will point it out!) Can this sin take over in your life? Give an example.
