### John 10:1-21

#### I. True Shepherd\* v. 1-6

“Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth \_\_\_\_\_ by the door into the sheepfold, but \_\_\_\_\_ up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. <sup>2</sup>But he that entereth in by the \_\_\_\_\_ is the shepherd of the sheep. <sup>3</sup>To him the porter (Lit. \_\_\_\_\_) openeth; and the sheep \_\_\_\_\_ his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_ them out.

<sup>4</sup>And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth \_\_\_\_\_ them, and the sheep \_\_\_\_\_ him: for they \_\_\_\_\_ his voice. <sup>5</sup>And a stranger will they \_\_\_\_\_ follow, but will flee from him: for they know \_\_\_\_\_ the voice of strangers. <sup>6</sup>This parable (Gk - \_\_\_\_\_) spake Jesus unto them: but they understood \_\_\_\_\_ what things they were which he spake unto them.”

“This parable spake Jesus unto them: but they understood not” –

## **II. Good Shepherd v. 7-11**

“Then said Jesus unto them \_\_\_\_\_, Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the \_\_\_\_\_ of the sheep. <sup>8</sup>All that ever came \_\_\_\_\_ me are thieves and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them. <sup>9</sup>I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved (Lit. - \_\_\_\_\_), and shall go in and out, and find pasture. <sup>10</sup>The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have \_\_\_\_\_, and that they might have it more \_\_\_\_\_. <sup>11</sup>I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd \_\_\_\_\_ his life for the sheep.” John 10:7-11

### III. Only Shepherd v. 12-16

“But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose \_\_\_\_\_ the sheep are \_\_\_\_\_, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. <sup>13</sup>The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth \_\_\_\_\_ for the sheep. <sup>14</sup>I am the good shepherd, and \_\_\_\_\_ my sheep, and am \_\_\_\_\_ of mine. <sup>15</sup>As the Father \_\_\_\_\_ me, even so \_\_\_\_\_ I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup>And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I \_\_\_\_\_ bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be \_\_\_\_\_ fold (Gk - \_\_\_\_\_), and \_\_\_\_\_ shepherd.” John 10:12-16

#### IV. Obedient Shepherd v. 17-18

“Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. <sup>18</sup>“No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father.” John 10:17-18
