“It is almost surprising after such a scathing denunciation of the religious systems that existed in our Lord’s day that Jesus was invited into the home of a Pharisee. But Jesus accepted the invitation and went...” These are the words of JD Pentecost as he began his look at this passage. We must remember that, at this point in Jesus’ ministry, the Religious Leaders were busy looking for opportunities to find _____ in Him. No sincere Pharisee would openly have Jesus to his home. And we will find it didn’t take long, and conflict arose again!
